On behalf of the Guyanese delegation, it is my honor to address this 2025 session of the Washington Model OAS. Our presence here speaks to our commitment to advancing the shared values of democracy, social justice, and prosperity for all peoples of the Americas. Our team's mission reflects Guyana's holistic approach to building a more just and prosperous Americas that balances political stability, social well-being, and forward-thinking innovation.

The overarching mission of the Guyanese Delegation to the General Assembly of the OAS is to present our draft resolution addressing the consequences of regional political changes and their impact on the state because we have seen firsthand how sudden shifts in governance can disrupt economies, erode public trust, and deepen vulnerability in countries like ours. Thus, identifying a clear regional framework is the first step to strengthening our institutions' resilience and protecting our citizens' rights in the face of unpredictable transitions. As is evident, between 2021 and 2024, there has been an increase in the number of refugees from Latin America, driven in part by instability in several countries across the region. Political instability, particularly in Venezuela, has led to a noteworthy increase in refugees, with a record number of 25,358 resettled to the U.S. in FY2024, over half of whom (12,875) were from Venezuela (Immigration Forum, 2024).

Therefore, we believe that addressing political stability goes hand in hand with protecting our most vulnerable populations, embracing inclusive decision-making, and staying open to new technologies that can advance development across our Hemisphere.

Thus, our delegation will advocate for vital areas that matter deeply to Guyana—such as ensuring children's rights, integrating gender perspectives into foreign policy, promoting universal access to healthcare, and harnessing artificial intelligence to benefit everyone responsibly.

Guyana is committed to cooperative dialogue and tangible results. We can only move forward if we work side by side, forging proposals that respect national sovereignty while elevating the interests we all share. We are ready and eager to collaborate with you and look forward to building solutions that have a meaningful impact for our region.
